- The <u>Decision</u> on the European Year of Skills was adopted on 11 May.
- The Year will take place in the period of 9 May 2023 to 8 May 2024.



Skills shortages as a challenge and skilled workforce as an enabler

Why a European Year of Skills?



28 occupations, employing 14% in the EU workforce (27 million), were classified as **shortages** in 2020



77% of companies struggled to find employees with the required skills in 2019



adult learning participation rate remains low, around 37%



over 90% of jobs require digital skills, however 54% of the adult population in Europe has basic digital skills



European Pillar of Social Rights

 $(2021 \rightarrow 2030)$

At least: 78% of the population aged 20 to 64 should be in employment by 2030

Current level: 73.1% (2019)

60% of all adults should participate in training every year by 2030

Current level: 37.4% (2016)

Reduce by 15 million

the number of people at risk of poverty or social exclusion by 2030

Current level: 91 million persons (2019)






Rationale of the Council Recommendation on Upskilling Pathways



Target group

lower skilled adults



Objective

Provide them with opportunity to acquire:

- minimum level of literacy, numeracy and digital competence
- and/or a wider set of skills
- and/or encourage them to make a progress towards a qualification



Rationale

Three-step personalised support

- Skills assessment
- Provision of tailored and flexible learning offer
- Validation and recognition of skills
- + outreach, guidance and support measures

Evaluation of the Council Recommendation on Upskilling Pathways

- Aim: To look into implementation in Member States, and assess progress made
- Reference period: 2016 2021
- **Scope:** EU 27
- Publication planned: approx. July 2023


Individual learning accounts

- increase individuals' incentives and motivation to seek training.






